<p>Themes: learning from each other</p> <p>On our first day we will have an energetic game to get to know each other, followed by an interactive exercise that will present opportunities for us to learn from each other in different ways.</p> <p>In the afternoon participants will have the choice between a range of member-led sessions, all offering opportunities to learn new resilience building approaches and ways of working.</p> <p>We will finish by looking forward as to how GNDR will strengthen its learning with the introduction of a learning strategy.</p>	<p>Themes: governance, membership</p> <p>Our second day will start with a site visit to explore some government and local resilience building activities in Kuala Lumpur.</p> <p>Upon our return participants will meet in regions with their Regional Representatives, giving members the opportunity to ask about how their interests are advanced at the global level by their regional representatives. Participants will then get a chance to share their particular challenges with their regional colleagues and use the network to crowd source solutions.</p> <p>We will finish by looking forward as to how GNDR can strengthen our governance mechanisms further.</p>	<p>Themes: multistakeholder partnerships, networks</p> <p>An exciting panel event will launch the third day, where a successful example of multistakeholder collaboration for resilience will be analysed by the different actors involved.</p> <p>Throughout the day we will be offering participants the opportunity to be trained in Brokering Partnerships by the Partnership Brokers Association. In addition, there will be a session on how CSOs can work with governments on the development of National DRR Strategies, and member-led sessions with tools and tips for collaborating in different circumstances.</p> <p>We will finish by looking forward as to how GNDR can strengthen systematic collaboration across the network with the introduction of our Community Platform.</p>	<p>Themes: advocacy, fundraising</p> <p>The network is undertaking our next <i>Views from the Frontline</i> (VFL) this year and everyone can play a role. The joint initiative and ways to be involved will be presented in a Secretariat-led session, followed by 3 parallel sessions that will provide tools for us to play these different roles in VFL.</p> <p>We will then wrap up by lunch with a closing from key note speakers.</p>

Session Formats

The sessions will take different formats to maximise uptake of different knowledge and sharing of ideas:

- **Perspectives** explore a particular issue and highlight different perspectives on it, with a particular focus on giving voice to those typically 'left behind'
- **Dialogues** aim to bring together government officials and civil society representatives on specific policy issues
- **Case Studies** are focused around specific case studies, including good practices and learnings
- **Problem-Solving** sessions encourage members to bring a particular problem and crowdsource solutions from other members
- **Capacity-building** sessions aim at providing formalised training on particular subject areas
